


# ABOUT THE ARTWORK

Last December, more than twenty students entered a competition created in partnership between the Sarasota Film Festival and Ringling College of Art and Design. Entrants were tasked with taking the tagline "See and Be Seen" and creating artwork that would breathe life into this year's SFF campaign, serving as inspiration for the entire season.

After presenting their ideas and works to SFF's Board and staff, the winning Artist was chosen. Sarasota native Tyler Mathis has created a triptych of posters organized around the homophonic, multi-dimensional play on words, as both See/Sea and Seen/Scene can be used interchangeably. You will see Tyler's artwork throughout SFF on street banners, advertisements, trailers and merchandise. Additionally, his prize for winning the contest was to secure a staff position as animator of SFF's screenwash, the sponsor thank you animation that runs ahead of all films during the Festival.

Throughout the Festival, you will also see SFF logo animations created by Ringling College of Art and Design's Motion Design Department. This partnership spanning many years gives the sophomore class of Motion Design Department students a semester to create matching 15 second logo reveals and 30 second looping backdrop animations to be used at various Festival events. Congratulations go to Brittany Maugeri and Pramod Sonea whose animation will kick off the Festival on Opening Night, March 31st. Many thanks to Ringling College, the staff, and the students of the Collaboratory and Motion Design programs for their hours of creativity and dedication.

# BOOKER FILM ACADEMY PREMIERE

Making mistakes is a part of growing up. There can be no doubt about the role these trials and tribulations play in our development as adults. Unfortunately, as our country's legal system begins to see children as adults in court more and more, many teenagers slip up, get caught, and can never recover or learn from what got them in trouble in the first place.

REDIRECTION is a documentary created by the Booker High School Film Academy class of 2017 that tells the true story of a viable alternative to the draconian measures of typical court procedures for serious teenage offenders: Teen Court. Teen Court works within the greater community to rehabilitate and re-engage young perpetrators and help them get back on track towards a healthy and successful future.





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## FILM & FAMILIES

Sarasota Film Festival is committed to educating and inspiring a future generation of filmgoers and filmmakers.

Beyond our annual Festival, the SFF Education Department offers a number of scholastic programs. Applying the State of Florida Educational standards, students from elementary school through college participate in programming designed to encourage thoughtful citizenship and creativity through film literacy.

#### SFF EDUCATION

The mission of the Education Department is to inspire, educate, and entertain students by promoting creativity, collaboration, and community involvement.

Operating both in and out of local classrooms, our department has reached over 15,000 students through filmmaking, film review, screenwriting, and movie screening programs which connect students to meaningful content. When possible we enhance our curriculum with guest appearances by filmmakers and other creative talent associated with the filmmaking process.

#### CLASSROOM CRITIC

We believe it is important that students learn how to "read" films just as they learn to read books. Classroom critic is the vehicle through which SFF delivers curriculum using film review, screenwriting and movie screening encouraging mindfulness and critical thinking skills.



#### **SEE JANE STUDIO**

In this partnership with The Geena Davis Institute on Gender in Media, young boys and girls learn to evaluate the ways gender roles are portrayed in TV and film. These lesson plans help students to be conscious media consumers as they learn about gender representations and stereotypes in media and the world around them.



#### JUNIOR JURY

Participation is highly competitive to be a part of Junior Jury, and students are chosen by the SFF Education Director.

Participants screen and review youth films and select the winning film to be screened during Hollywood Nights, the award celebration for youth filmmakers. They also meet with the professional SFF Jury where they learn more about the process of adjudicating films and film industry careers.



## FILM & FAMILIES

#### KIDS VIP TRIPS

These trips provide film-screening field trips free of charge on school days to the Hollywood 20 theater for more than 2.000 area students. This program is in partnership with Embracing Our Differences, a local nonprofit which focuses on diversity and the arts in our community.

Through this program, Sarasota and Manatee counties view age-specific film programs and have the opportunity to interact with visiting professional filmmakers.



Our newest program woke! brings films focused on topical social issues to college campuses in the hope of encouraging students to intellectually awaken, engage in discourse, and to be active participants in the culture they will one day lead. We work with higher education institutions to bring outdoor evening screenings to their campuses. After the film, the audience engages in panel-style discussions which link film analysis to the issues portrayed in each screening.



Each year as part of the larger Festival, SFF Education presents youthFEST: a family-friendly slate of films free for kids ages 12 and under! All youthFEST films are indicated in pink on the schedule grid – pages 68-76.
